
The Exposure Triangle

How your camera records light



How to find the right balance

Ask yourself the following questions:

- 1) How much light is available?
 Choose the lowest ISO value possible to get the best quality. Up to ISO 400 for outdoors.
 Up to ISO 3200 for indoors.
- 2) Do I need to isolate the subject? Choose an Aperture below f4 to isolate your subject with blur (e.g. portraits), go above if you need things to be sharp (e.g. landscapes).
- 3) Do I want motion blur?

 Choose a Shutter Speed below 1/125s for motion blur, go above for freezing movement.

REMEMBER

ISO, Aperture and Shutter Speed work TOGETHER to give you the optimal exposure.
